Ballmer Group Donates \$10 Million To Teach For America

Funds Raised Will Support Recruitment and Development of Corps Members Who Teach in High-Need Schools and Alumni Who Work in Schools and Across Sectors to Eliminate Educational Inequity

NEW YORK, Feb. 20, 2018 – Ballmer Group, the philanthropic organization founded by Steve and Connie Ballmer, is granting \$10 million, over five years, to Teach For America. The nonprofit organization will use the gift to recruit, train, and develop a diverse network of leaders who confront educational inequity through teaching and work with unwavering commitment from every sector to create a nation free from educational injustice.

"This extraordinary gift from Ballmer Group will advance our work to find, develop, and support a network of leaders who are committed to ensuring that all students in our country have the access and opportunities they deserve," said Elisa Villanueva Beard, chief executive officer of Teach For America. "Our network is diverse in every way, and together we share an unwavering belief in the potential of every child and a fierce commitment to fulfilling that potential."

Teach For America this spring is launching a new platform to engage and mobilize its diverse and powerful network of more than 50,000 alumni and 6,000 corps members. Called TFA Connect, the virtual platform will feature a national job board and directory that will empower alumni leaders to search for talent and self-organize around interests and issues that will help achieve educational equity.

"We support Teach For America in creating a pipeline of support to help close the opportunity gap in education," said Jeff Edmondson, Managing Director of Ballmer Group. "The vast majority of Teach For America alumni continue to lead in classrooms, on boards, as elected officials, school administrators, and college deans. Their recruiting model helps ensure that teachers and future civic leaders represent the communities and students they serve, which helps all students – regardless of their race, ethnicity, or income level – get a high-quality education, which leads to greater economic mobility."

Ballmer Group is making two additional gifts to support Teach For America in regions that are projected to grow their alumni and corps member base and strengthen their network of diverse leaders driving and supporting positive change across sectors that influence education. Teach For America-Los Angeles is slated to receive \$2.25 million through 2020, and Teach For America-Washington will leverage at \$1.5 million matching grant over the same time period.

"Teach For America has played an integral role in the Los Angeles education ecosystem for 26 years by contributing thousands of educational leaders, from the classroom to the capitol, who are motivated to eliminate education inequity in our city," said Lida Jennings, executive director of Teach For America—Los Angeles.
