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**TEACH FOR AMERICA STATEMENT ON THE INTRODUCTION OF THE
BIPARTISAN ESTHER MARTINEZ NATIVE AMERICAN LANGUAGES
PRESERVATION ACT**

NEW YORK, February 7, 2019—*The Esther Martinez Native American Languages Preservation Act, which supports language immersion programs, language survival schools, and language restoration programs for American Indian, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian students, was introduced in the U.S. House and Senate on January 30, 2019. This reauthorization would extend funding to 2023 and add more flexibility to help smaller tribes access grant funding, allowing a greater number of students to learn their Native language and contribute to the preservation of their community's identity, culture, and traditions while developing their own leadership.*

“We applaud and support the bipartisan work of Congress to ensure the Esther Martinez Native American Languages Preservation Act is renewed. We must provide continued funding and resources that support the preservation and protection of this nation’s indigenous languages. Indigenous languages are critical to the cultural identity, traditions, customs and history of Native people and tribes, and teaching indigenous languages is necessary for providing Native students with a well-rounded education, culturally responsive teaching, and curriculum that affirms their identity. Languages unique and spoken only in this hemisphere are the ancestral connection to who we are and the journeys we will take.”
