Mark Montgomery, a fourth generation Texan, is the market coverage strategy director for Amegy Bank. Most recently he served as the Houston Market President and later CEO for BBVA Compass in Houston. Colin Pogge is a Partner with Gibbs & Bruns, LLC. He began addressing educational inequity as a 2005 Teach For America Houston corps member where he taught 5th grade at HISD's Judson Elementary.
