This partnership between the Columbia Teachers College and Teach For America • Indianapolis is a fast-track path to school leadership that prepares Teach For America alumni to become principals in Indianapolis.



This year, up to 12 exceptional candidates who demonstrate their long-term commitment to public education and desire to lead in Indianapolis will be selected for the fellowship.

What is the fellowship?

For two consecutive summers, Indianapolis Principal Fellows attend a rigorous six-week session at Columbia's Summer Principals Academy tuition-free and assume a full-time administrative position in Indianapolis during the school year between.

Who are we looking for?

The Indianapolis Principal Fellowship seeks candidates who are:

- exceptional educators with significant experience and demonstrated success of leading students to significant academic gains in an urban education environment
- proven leaders with relationship-building capabilities and experience in instructional leadership roles and community leadership positions
- committed to long-term school leadership, urban schools, and education in Indianapolis

Why Indianapolis?

We are at an unparalleled moment in our fight to close the achievement gap in Indianapolis. Recent education reform initiatives, led by our growing alumni force, recently resulted in Bellwether Education Partners ranking Indiana as the number one state for education reform in the country.* Just entering our sixth year as a Teach For America region, Indianapolis has nearly 500 corps members and alumni working across all sectors. In 2012, Indianapolis Mayor Greg Ballard appointed Jason Kloth (Rio Grande Valley Corps '03) as Indianapolis' first Deputy Mayor of Education and a number of alumni serve in key support roles to the Deputy Mayor, including chief of staff and director of charter schools. Currently, 34 alumni are leading schools as school system leaders, principals, or assistant principals. Even more alumni are working as instructional leaders, veteran teachers, and civic leaders.
